


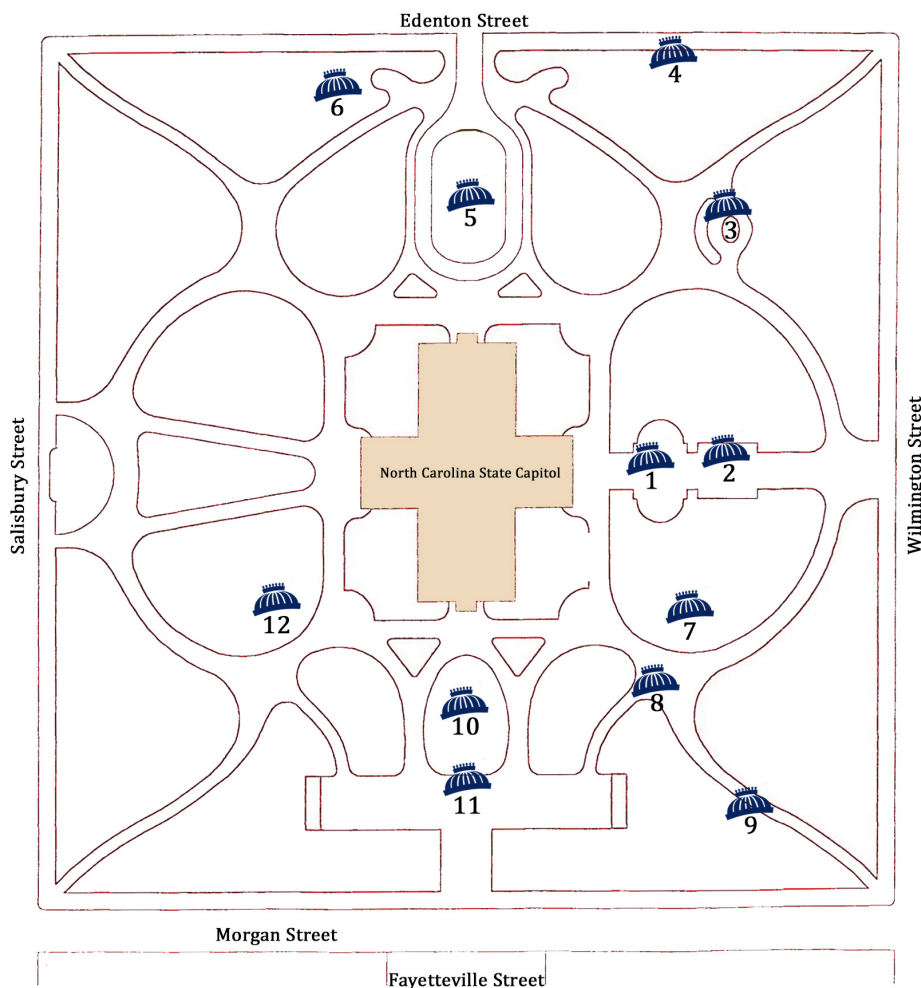
Outdoor Scavenger Hunt

North Carolina State Capitol

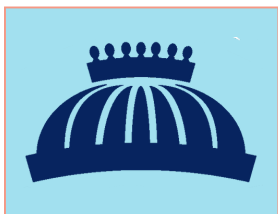

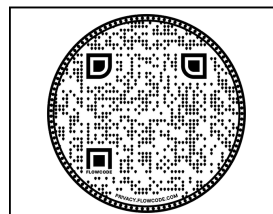

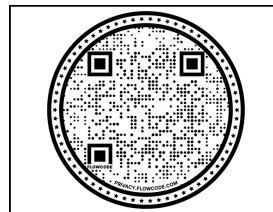
The Capitol is not a king or queen, but still wears this.

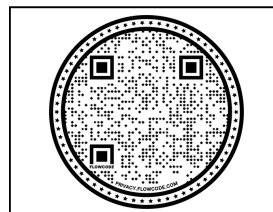
North Carolina gave the country these national leaders.



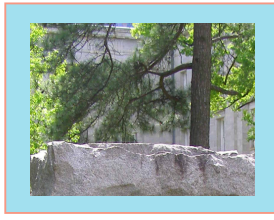

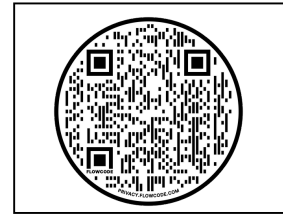
This monument shows three soldiers.



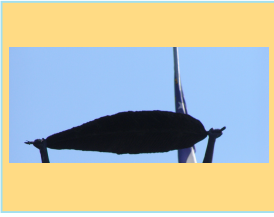

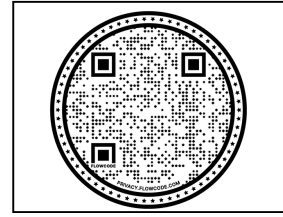
This simple gray marker is named for a tree.

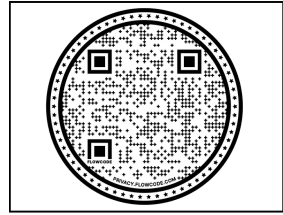
The only woman on the Capitol grounds holds her hands above her head.

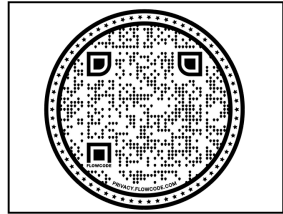
Probably the only stop on this list that has a distinct smell!
Hint: it's also one of our official state symbols.



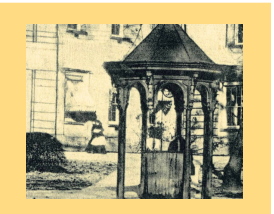

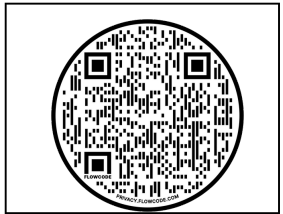
This man carries a book - he was an educator!

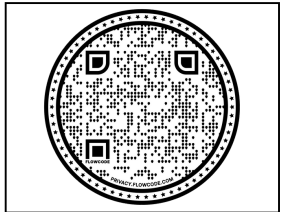
Be careful you don't fall down this stop! (Jk, it's capped.)



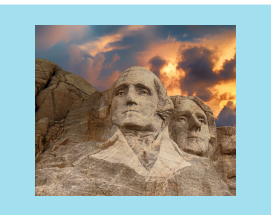

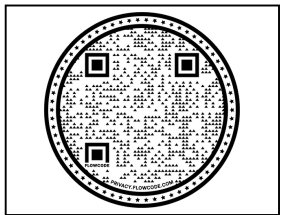
These three stones almost look like gravestones, but they are tools to help measure something very important.

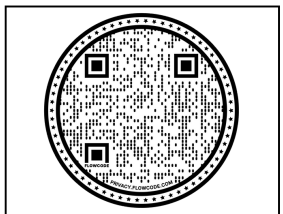
This president was NOT from North Carolina.



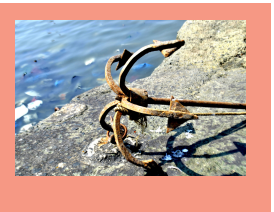
