North Carolina gave the country these national leaders


This marker recognizes the Capitol as historically important.


This stone might be hard to find it's a part of the building!

This monument shows three soldiers.


The only woman on the Capitol grounds holds her hands above her head.

This man carries a book - he was an educator!






These two men served in the highest elected office in North Carolina.


This president was NOT from North Carolina.
