- 5. How did the Emancipation Proclamation and the Union occupation of coastal North Carolina affect the Collins Family and the enslaved community?
- 6. Compare and contrast the lifestyles of the wealthy planters (Collins Family) and the enslaved community at Somerset Place?
- 7. What were some of the circumstances the enslaved community and overseers at Somerset Place faced during the American Civil War?
- 8. Why did Josiah Collins name the plantation Somerset Place?
- 9. How many enslaved people lived in the twenty-six homes at Somerset Place by 1843?
- 10. The former enslaved community of Somerset plantation dug twenty-miles of deep canals and eighty miles of intersecting cross ditches throughout the property. For what were these waterways used?
