Build-A-Museum:

Pre-Visit Activity and Digital Lesson Plan

Grades: 6-12 (adaptable for younger) **Objective:** Use this lesson plan as a pre-visit activity before an outreach program, or as a stand-alone project for students to learn more about Thomas Day State Historic Site and other history museums or sites.

Students will learn:

- The importance of historical preservation and museums as educational and community spaces
- The history of Thomas Day and his importance as a free person of color in Virginia and North Carolina

You will need:

- Pre-Visit presentation slides
- Build-A-Museum Worksheet (including sample and Tips & Hints page)
- Optional: Reading Excerpt "Brief Biography of Thomas Day"
- Optional: Access to computers for independent student research

Introduction:

- Ask students what they think of when they hear the words "Museum" and "Historic Site"
- Record their answers. Then ask if they have ever heard of Thomas Day (most students haven't!)

- **Grades 8-12**: Have students read the "*Brief Biography of Thomas Day*"
- Use the presentation slides to the students. Use the discussion questions on the slides to guide conversation in groups or pairs.

Task:

- Part One: In groups or pairs, have students answer the discussion questions. Have them use the worksheet to take notes on their answers, then discuss with the class.
- Part Two: Using the next worksheet page, have students pick a historical figure and design a museum around them. Note: Students may use a historical figure they have already learned about, or they can conduct research on their own about a new figure. Alternatively, they can use themselves as a subject (this is a good option if you are short on time).
 - Optional extension (grades 6-12): Have the students work to create a presentation (powerpoint, poster, etc.) and present on the topic to the class.
 - Optional extension: Have students explore other Sites and Museums websites to get ideas (dncr.nc.gov)
